<i>STUDENT SELF-CHECK LIST</i>

Prior to submitting your final proposal, review the following checklist to ensure completeness:

1. Upper division courses contain at least 45 but not more than 54 units.
2. At least 30 units are within Letters and Science teaching departments.
3. Proposal does not exceed a maximum of 10 upper division units in Special Study course work (194H, 199, and 198's). If they are included, a course description is attached.
4. Courses completed and in progress have been identified on the final proposal form. Grades must be included.
5. Check on course availability.
6. Faculty endorsements have been secured.
7. An online "Petition for Declaration or Change of Major" form has been submitted (appropriate signatures will be obtained upon approval of proposal).
8. Course descriptions for courses taken at other schools or on the Education Abroad Program which are included as part of the major are attached.
9. If planning a double major, you have reviewed the College policies and procedures for petitioning for a double major and have acquired the necessary forms (available at the Dean's Office).
10. Your final proposal is **typed** and **attached in the following order**:
 - a. Cover sheet.
 - b. Personal statement.
 - c. Final major proposal.
 - d. Signed faculty adviser evaluation forms (at least 2).
 - e. Student self-check list.
 - f. Side-by-side evaluation of similar programs at 2 - 3 other reputable 4-year universities

Incomplete petitions will be returned to the student.
